Recently Chairperson Al Lucas provided a final report on White Cane activities for this year.

A new record of \$23,634.99 was collected.

Surpassing last year's record collection by 15%. Thirty-nine members 61%) participated a good effort but not perfect. New members such as Lions Lynn Demsky, Jim Madson, Chris Kowal, and Lee Musson were well represented. Spouses and friends such as Mary Beane and friends, Joyce Murphy, and Sharon Janabet were a big help. And don't forget Molly, Lion Joe Vigliotti's best helper.

Some members, who could not devote time to the storefronts and streets, contributed personally and we thank them heartily. Thanks to Lion Steve Shelton who helped with business solicitations. We even received a \$500 check from Century 21 Real Estate. Lion John Benzik collected White Cane at the GM Hamtramck plant gate during shift change. Lion Rod Bunia collected in his office building. So you can see there are alternative ways of participating in White Cane. There were some unanticipated incidents (Lion Skip Coatsworth will be seen in a future episode of "Cops") but overall it was a great week. 21 people collected over \$500 and 7 collected over \$1,000 with the top collector being Lion Skip at \$2,258. These persons will be able to receive a souvenir from the Leader dogs Catalog.

A great White Cane year and next year with just a few more Lions participating we will hit \$25,000.


