Lions International Peace Poster Contest Update

Lion Dave Bates reports that students from the Rochester area participated again this year in Lion Internationals Peace Poster Contest, locally sponsored by our Rochester lions Club. This is an annual international competition open to middle schoolers. Competitors were to draw a poster of their own design with this years' theme of "give peace a chance".

Entries were displayed at the Rochester Hills Library during the end of October.

West Middle School was well represented locally and the results reflected their involvement. Judges selected posters for award. three Winning first place was Jennifer Choi. Second place went to Jeremy Schankin and third place to Taylor Lane. Winners were awarded prize money and certificates

Jennifer Choi's winning poster was forwarded to the Lions District 11-A2 competition where the winning posters for Oakland and Macomb counties will be judged. Ultimately, one Grand Prize winning poster will be selected from twenty-four international finalists from an initial field of 325,000 posters which have been submitted in this world wide annual competition. The winner will be awarded \$2500 at a ceremony at the United Nations in March.
