

Recycle Ink Update



Jessica Parker, Program Coordinator with Recycle Ink was our speaker at the September 18th meeting. Jessica gave us some ideas on how to promote our recycle project to earn more money. One area we need to focus on is referring other organizations because we earn 75 cents on each cartridge or cell phone they send in. The District earns money on all that we recycle because we are a referral for them.

If you know of an organization that wants to sign up, they can do it easily online by going to the website www.recycleink.com. For our club to get credit they need to put in the referral code assigned to us which is 2880.

Since we started collecting ink cartridges and phones in May we have earned the following:

May \$ 2.00 June \$ 4.00 July \$16.75 (\$12.75 from referrals) August \$32.50 (\$4.50 from referrals) Total \$55.25

Some more interesting facts:

There are a total of 166 Lions Clubs in the US signed up. In Michigan, four districts are represented and over \$9,000 has been raised so far this year. The top Club has raised \$2200 this year, and the top Lioness Club has raised \$750 and they just signed up in May.

We can potentially do very well at this fundraiser, and it requires very little work. If you know of a location where we can place a recycle box, let Lion Sherry know. There are also small plastic bags available that can be handed out to family and friends that have an identifying bar code on them. All you have to do is slip the cartridge(s) in the bag and drop it in the mail box. The postage is pre-paid.

Please help promote this! All proceeds are going to Campaign Sight First II.


If you are interested in attending any of the District meetings, please let the Lion President know so the effort can be coordinated and one check can be sent with all registrants.

LIONS INTERNATIONAL PEACE POSTER CONTEST

The Theme for the 2006-2007 Peace Poster Contest is "Celebrate Peace". Children in the community can be sponsored by Lions Clubs in local schools or organized youth groups. Students, ages 11, 12 or 13 on November 15, 2006 are eligible to participate. Students are encouraged to visually depict their interpretation of the contest's theme.

Each poster is judged on originality, artistic merit and expression of the theme. There are several levels of judging the posters advance through; local, district, multiple district and international. One grand prize winner and 23 merit award winners are selected at the international level by judges from the art, peace, youth, education and media communities.

The international grand prize winner will receive a trip to a special award ceremony with the sponsoring club president and two family members at Lions Day with the United Nations scheduled for New York City. At the ceremony the winning artist will be presented with an engraved plaque and a cash prize of US \$2500. Each of the 23 merit award winners will receive a cash award of US \$500 and a certificate of achievement.

The Rochester Lions Club Peace Poster Committee is chaired by Lion David Bates. He will have the posters that have been prepared by local school students on display in the Rochester Hills Public Library Youth Room during the last week in October. We will acknowledge the winners in November. The talent displayed by the participating students in the past has been incredible. This year will surely be no different!
