More on Identity Theft

If you haven't read your March, 2007 AARP Bulletin, you might want to take a look at the article on page 24 entitled "Grave Robbery" by Sid Kirchheimer. In a nutshell, this article talks about identity theft of the deceased. When a loved one dies, here's a few things you can do to protect their name and reputation.

- ? Don't include details such as day and month of birth (use only the year) or addresses in obituaries. You not only want to prevent identity theft, but you want to keep thieves from visiting the house, helping themselves while you're interring a loved one.
- ? Mail copies of the death certificate to all three credit-reporting bureaus Equifax, Experian and TransUnion and all credit issuers to cancel accounts right after the person dies.
- ? Contact your state department of motor vehicles to cancel any driver's license and prevent duplicates from being issued.
- ? A few weeks after taking these measures, run a credit report on the deceased to ensure there is no suspicious activity. Free Credit reports are available at www.annualcreditreport.com

WHITE CANE WEEK ALERT continued

<u>Sign-Up Sheets</u>: The sign-up sheets are in the possession of Al Lucas and are circulated during Lions meetings prior to White Cane Week for the purpose of providing members the opportunity to volunteer. The work shifts are morning (9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.) and afternoon (2:00 p.m. to 7:00p.m.). **However, feel free to work whenever your schedule permits.** Just show up at White Cane Headquarters and you will be given an assignment or call Al Lucas or any of the Site Captains for an assignment.

<u>Interaction with the Public</u>: If you haven't tried soliciting, you should. Most of the public are friendly and generous. Of course, we must also be pleasant and courteous when we collect funds for the best charity in town – Leader Dogs for the Blind. Following are some guidelines.

- ? Smile at the public.
- ? Greet **every** potential donor. Say "Good Morning", "Good Afternoon", "Great Day", "How are you?" etc. Make eye contact.
- ? Follow your greeting with a request to "Help Leader Dogs for the Blind", "Help the Blind" etc.
- ? Thank the donor.

<u>What to Do with Collected Funds</u>: Rochester Lions Club solicitors are requested to do the following upon completion of your planned solicitation schedule.

- ? Count collected money.
- ? Write a personal check for the total amount collected made payable to "Rochester Lions Club Charities Inc." and give the check to Al Lucas.
- ? Inform Al Lucas in writing with date, site locations, hours worked per location and the amount of money collected per location.

Equipment Return: All equipment must be returned to Al Lucas following completion of White Cane Week. Please return all equipment to Al at scheduled club meetings, at White Cane Headquarters during White Cane Week or at his home (248-651-0474).

PARTICIPATION AWARDS:

Individuals that collect \$500 or more are eligible to receive a gift from Leader Dogs for the Blind. Chairman Al will order the gifts and distribute the gifts at an appropriate Lions Club meeting.
