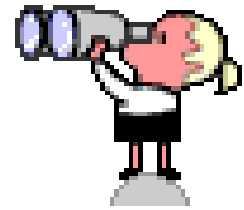

Recipe: Cedar-Plank Salmon

A “Heart Healthy Choice”

What you'll need:

- 2 tsp lemon pepper
- 1 tsp granulated garlic
- 1 tsp dry tarragon
- 1 tsp dry basil
- 1 Tbsp paprika
- 1 Tbsp kosher salt
- 2 Tsp brown sugar
- 2 skinless salmon fillets (6 oz each) Wild Caught Atlantic Salmon if possible.
- 1 lemon



Health & Nutrition

1. Blend all ingredients except the fish and lemon in a mixing bowl. Transfer, label, wrap tightly, and store at room temperature until needed.
2. Sprinkle both sides of the salmon evenly with the dry rub and then press the seasonings into the flesh. Refrigerate, uncovered, for at least 2 hours and up to 12 hours before cooking. Grill on BBQ over “indirect” heat or oven bake (preheated to 425F) on plank for approx 10-15 minutes max or until “golden brown.” [An excellent dish for those warm summer nights on the patio...](#)

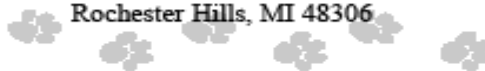
