ATM Machine Scams on the Rise!!

ATM card skimming is the latest "rage" with criminals. These very sophisticated criminal types now install minute information "capture" devices to "skim" all the data from the magnetic strip on the back of your

ATM card.

It's similar to identity theft that takes place in a restaurant when you pay your bill with a credit card. The moment the waiter/waitress takes your card away from the table (out of sight)...that is when the "deed" is done...typically with hand-held palm-sized readers..that capture all your data from the card's magnetic strip..and then transmits the data to accomplices across the nation or around the world...in order to produce phony I.D. or an exact copy of your credit card.

But let's get back to the ATM fraud that's occurring with increasing frequency at ATM machines across the globe. It's become increasingly difficult for the average person to readily detect these new high tech fraud devices designed to skim all the information (your bank balance, bank acct #, withdrawal-deposit history, etc.). It's upsetting, to say the least, to even think about having one's personal financial information compromised.

Our recommendation is to have a chat with your financial institution that issued your ATM card. If they cannot guarantee system security beginning with the ATM machine access, then seriously consider suspending the use of your ATM card(s) until the situation is resolved to your satisfaction.

"Hands Across the Water... Meeting with German Lions Clubs"

Lions Randy & Sharon Whitmire took a recent two week vacation in Bavaria, southern Germany where Randy's son, Jason Whitmire, his wife and Randy's two grandchildren, Constantin (age 4) and Marie (7 months) live in the village of Seehausen am Staffelsee (by the lake). Besides enjoying the beautiful Bavarian countryside, German hospitality and the Zugspitze

(highest peak in Germany), Lion Randy and Lion Sharon also visited with both the Murnau Staffelsee and Mittenwald Lions clubs to learn more about their activities and events while also sharing important information with the German Lions about Leader Dogs for the Blind.

The world has been reduced to a manageable size with email, websites, blogs, which enable us

to instantly communicate with family, friends, loved ones and, of course, Lions serving in other countries. "When Greg Grabowski asked if I could see about forging closer ties with German Lions, I jumped at the chance," said Lion Randy. "It's just one more way that we can extend our reach..through education, information and international fellowship," Lion Randy added.

The Murnau Staffelsee Lions have built up a wonderful annual "Book Market" which is held in one of the old military ca-



sernes in Murnau. They routinely handle more than 60,000 books, mostly in German, but also some in English. The municipal government of Murnau permits them to use the old military venue rent-free. The Mittenwald Lions, on the other hand, have supported the "German Centre for Pediatric and Adolescent Rheumatology" located in Garmisch near the German-Austrian border for many years. Lion Randy will do a short presentation on this visit soon.

Rochester Lions can also experience the same sense of wonderment when they travel to other states and other countries. Lionism is represented in more than 205 countries comprised of more than 1.3 million Lions worldwide. Don't let opportunity pass you by. Reach out and maximize your sphere of influence in the world. All -Wrapped -Up Salad—Heart Healthy

A quick and easy 20 minute recipe which serves 2. Ingredients:

2 8-in whole grain, whole wheat flour tortillas
3/4 cup shredded romaine or fresh spinach
1/2 avodaco, halved, seeded, peeled, and sliced
1/4 cucumber, halved lengthwise, seeded, and thinly sliced
1 oz Monterey Jack cheese with jalapeno peppers, shredded
Your favoriate salsa....to taste

On each tortilla, layer romaine, avocado, cucumber, and cheese. Roll up tightly. If desired, halve tortillas diagonally. Wrap each tightly with plastic wrap. Chill for up to 6 hours.
