On Monday January 18th David Mckenzie called me early in the morning and said that Lion Celia Domalewski was taken to Crittenton Hospital at 5:00 am with chest pains. After tests they found a main artery with a 99% blockage. They inserted stents. She was in Crittenton for a few days. She is now home and for this we are thankful.

January 12th, Tuesday a major earthquake struck southern Haiti, knocking down buildings and power lines and inflicting what its Ambassador to the United States called a catastrophe for the Western Hemisphere's poorest nation.

Now we know many thousands of Haitians have lost their lives and many are suffering with their injuries, no water, no food, very little medical attention or shelter. Lions Club International was one of the first to respond to this catastrophe by raising thousands of dollars to help the Haitian people.

As I write this I'm looking forward to Fire & Ice, contact Dave McKenzie to work this event. Hope to see you there.
