A few facts about Lions Bear Lake Camp

Lions Bear Lake Camp is owned and operated by Lions Visually Impaired Youth Camp, Inc. a 501C-3 Non Profit Corporation. The camp opened its doors in July, 2000. It is financially supported by Lions, Lioness and Leos throughout Michigan.



Visually Impaired Youth Sessions

Bear Lake Camp offers a camp program for visually impaired youth. The program focuses on having fun while developing self concepts, relationship learning, Independence with life skills and acquiring outdoor skills.



Hearing Impaired Youth Session

Bear Lake provides a one week camp experience for youth who are hearing impaired. The program is developed and

coordinated by teachers of the hearing impaired. It is geared to meet the unique needs of children who use listening and spoken language as their primary modes of communication. Our goal is to provide a camp rich with experiences that promote communication. While having fun, we will build vocabulary, focus on auditory skills and use good language to communicate with others.



Leadership Development Program

Program activities include: horseback riding, swimming, boating, hiking, crafts, nature, archery, teambuilding, overnight tent camping, games and drama. Older campers have the option to participate in leadership development activities. The

leadership development program runs through two summers with elevated experience and responsibilities in the 2nd year. Participants in the leadership development program must have been a camper for the regular Hearing Impaired Youth Camp.



Directions to Bear Lake for regular meeting on July 19

TAKE M-24 NORTH TO LAPEER. PROCEED THROUGH LAPEER GOING NORTH 4 MILES TO DALY ROAD.THERE IS A CAUTION LIGAT THIS INTERSECTION.

TURN RIGHT ON DALY ROAD AND TRAVEL EAST 3 MILES TO FISH LAKE ROAD.

TURN LEFT ON FISH LAKE ROAD AND TRAVEL NORTH 4 MILES TO KINGS MILL ROAD.

turn right on Kings Mill Road and travel East for $1\ \mbox{mile}$ to Five Lale Road.
