

Reyes' winning poster was chosen for its originality, artistic merit and portrayal of this year's theme "Children Know Peace."

Reyes' poster was chosen from the 126 posters from 60 countries that made it to the international level of judging after being narrowed down at local levels.

Annually, more than 350,000 entries are drawn by children ages 11 to 13.
