Is a unique, private, non-profit agency providing five-day residential, day care, and consultation/evaluation services to blind, multidisabled children ages one through twelve. Each program is individually designed to promote independence in all aspects of daily living. Penrickton Center utilizes its experience and expertise to teach and serve families, children and professionals

through support services, education and advocacy. Established in 1952 and is located in Taylor, Michigan. In 2013 the Rochester Lions Club donated \$5,700 to Penrickton to help support this important program.
