Laura is a International Specialist working for the IRS out of a Detroit office. She began by telling the history of the IRS and distributed copies of the first 1040 Income Tax form which stated "As provided by Act of Congress, approved October 3, 1913". She also distributed a sheet entitled "Your Rights as a Taxpayer". The first income tax was collected in 1862 for the Civil War and stopped after that ended. She went into detail on some specific topics and answered

question from the club members. She asked us who said "In this world nothing can be said to be certain, except death and taxes", answer was not Joe Black, it was Benjamin Franklin. Also she said "Taxes are what we pay for a civilized society".
