Lion Jerry Janabet 1947-2015

Jerry, a cabinet maker by trade, became a Rochester Lion in 1990 and was sponsored by Wallace "Doc" O'Brien. He immediately became active in the club and by serving as President in '94-'95. He served as the club Tail Twister several times and was the District Tail Twister for then District Governor Bill Hansen. He also assisted him in his campaign for International Director. He was active until his health prevented him from participating as much as he would have liked.

Jerry was known for his float designs for the Rochester Christmas Parade and also worked on the food wagon.

Jerry became a Melvin Jones Fellow in 1996, was awarded Lion of the year in 1997 and was made a Life Member in 2010.

He is survived by his wife Sharon (a former Lioness) two daughters and two stepsons.
