had any written policies regarding topics for speakers. Last Monday, at the meeting of the Board of Directors, the topic came up again. Needless to say, we had a very spirited discussion. Members had a lot of different opinions but in the

end, the Board voted to make it a policy that we would not allow Religious/Spiritual topics and that Political topics were to be limited to informational but not campaigning (ex. Mayor of Rochester comes to talk about new city developments that could affect the club is okay, campaigning is not).

The important point is to understand that the speakers are meant to entertain or inform, not to influence and that we want the club to be inclusive for all and stay away from topics that might make some people uncomfortable.

The Board also discussed precedent and it is important to note we will NOT be changing the songs we sing or the pledge of allegiance, both of which contain references to God and topics of this nature. It was unanimous that these practices have been around for a great many years and will continue.
