PDG Ronnie is a Progressive Melvin Jones Fellow (3), a Jack Wiech Fellow (2), and is an Endowment Gold Leaf and Silver Leaf Holder, a lifetime member of the Texas Lions Camp, and a Century Club member. He is an Eye Bank Ambassador, a Lifetime Member of the Lions Eve Bank of Texas in Houston, and a Certified Guiding Lion. Ronnie has been awarded an Eddie Munger Fellowship, Lion of the Year 2009-2010, four International President's Medals, an International Leaderhsip Medal, and nine International President's Certificates of Appreciation. He is one of only five District Governors in the world to receive four gold stars in his year 2013/2014 fo rthe Dream Achievers Awards. He has personally sponsored over 130 members and has been a part of starting 188 new clubs. Under his term as President of the Freeport Host

Lions Club, the club was recognized as the #1 growth club in all of North America and was awarded the Lions Clubs International Flag set, one of only twenty-one awarded worldwide.
