improvements that will facilitate their mission of providing pre-school children with free vision screening to detect poor vision or risk factors that interfere with normal visual development.

The April 19th meeting was one of our best ever, and that's not just me yapping! Several members told me how good the program was after the meeting. Lion Padilla went home and fired off an email to me, stating... "One of the best meetings I have ever attended." That evening, Deputy Hubanks from the Oakland County Sheriffs Department, and Margaret Scott, Assistant Prosecuting Attorney for Oakland County, gave an outstanding talk on "Identity Theft." The numbers are staggering: 27.3 million victims in the past 5 years; consumer losses of \$5 billion in out-of-pocket expenses; businesses have lost \$48 billion. Identity Theft has been declared the fastest growing crime today. Here are some of the preventive measures suggested:


- Never leave your wallet or purse unattended
- Destroy checks when closing an account
- Check bank statements closely
- Limit credit cards
- Destroy credit card solicitations
- Never give out identifiers to unknown people
- Shred credit card receipts, tax documents, and bank statements
- Shred anything that has your SSN on it before throwing it away

available to children from the Metropolitan Detroit area and the entire state of Michigan.

Thanks to the continued generous support of the Lions and Lioness Clubs throughout Michigan, Beaumont's Department of Speech and Language Services for Children has never denied services to a child during its many years of service. Special programs are offered to meet the needs of every child.
