GDABVI provides services and support to blind and visually impaired individuals to live productive, independent lives with confidence and dignity. They provide daily living skills, technology training, orientation and mobility, support groups, case management for basic needs, information and resources, and opportunities to socialize.





April presentation by Doug Rohrabaugh from O.A.T.S. O.A.T.S. is a therapeutic horse riding program in Ortonville, Michigan. They have 19 horses used for physical, emotional, and social development mainly for children. There are also programs for veterans and seniors.





May community service project at Dutton Farms in Rochester Hills. The Lions were given a tour and presentation. Then the team worked on raised beds that are used for growing produce.





May community service and fundraising;

- 1. May 10th—Lion members participated at the work day at Bear Lake camp. The Lions Bear Lake camp is a used as a visually impaired youth camp.
- 2. White Cane collection at Busch's market, This is an annual collection for Leader Dogs for the Blind.
- 3. Assisting the Rochester Area Neighborhood House food pantry with the processing of the food collected by the U.S. mail carriers. This year 27,000 lbs. of food needed to be sorted, dated, and stored.
